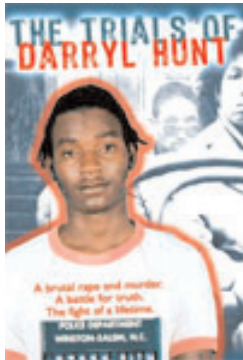




PF+C Cosponsors *The Trials of Darryl Hunt*

On Wednesday, March 19 at 6:00PM, Champlain College will present a screening of the critically acclaimed documentary, *The Trials of Darryl Hunt*. The event will take place at the college's Alumni Auditorium in Burlington and will include a discussion with Darryl Hunt, who spent 20 years in prison for a murder he didn't commit and Mark Rabil, the lawyer who represented him. The event is free and open to the public.

In 1984, based on the testimony of a former Ku Klux Klan member, Darryl Hunt was convicted of the rape and murder of a young, white newspaper reporter in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. He was sentenced by a jury of 11 whites and one black to life in prison. In 1994, DNA evidence exonerated Hunt of any crime; nevertheless he spent another ten years in jail.
