Attorney William D. Riley's White Paper entitled TRIA and Captives: The Role of Captive Insurance in the Terrorism Risk Insurance Program is included in the recently released Defense Research Institute's compendium of sixteen White Papers.

In the forward to the compendium written by Ronald R. Robinson, Chair, DRI's TRIA Subcommittee, the author outlines the compendium as "written for lawyers and others interested in the issues surrounding the need to insure against loss attributable to terrorist behavior.
